I was very excited to see that Vermont Wine Merchants has brought in five Turkish wines.

I'm always looking to expand the geographical horizons of our oenological explorations.

Turkey, a predominantly Muslim country, is not well known for their wines. This makes sense. But they've been producing wines there longer than France or Italy or any of the western European wine producers we're familiar with.

Turkey has the 4th largest vineyard acreage in the world, but only a tiny fraction of those grapes are turned into wine. The rest are dried, made into fruit juice or served fresh.
